1.4.2 How the feedback obtained is being analyzed and utilized for overall development of the institution? (maximum 500 words):				
<p>From session 2014 to 2017 predesigned feedback forms were given to the students and same feedback reports were manually collected for post analysis. After this collection feedback report were analysed considering three main parameters namely curriculum, teachers and library resources. Four point Liker respond mode ranging from very good to unsatisfactory was used for analysis of the parameters. After the analysis of the feedback reports efforts have been done to incorporate the same for over all development of the institution. Through the analysis of the teachers parameter we got a vivid picture of the divers aspects of teaching learning mechanism going on in the college. We used this input for the development of teaching learning process by trying to reduce our deficiencies.</p> <p>As far as library parameter is concerned analysis of student feedback report helped us in obtaining ideas about the strength of our library as well as its functioning mechanism . This is found to be very beneficial in taking some crucial steps viz. procurement of new edition of text book, reference books, installation of CC TV etc. for the enrichment of the library.</p> <p>Post analysis report of the curriculum was considered very seriously as a vital parameter. Students views regarding the diversified aspect of the curriculum as mentioned in the feedback forms. Later on we tried to convey these views to the university level through various formal and informal forums.</p> <p>For the session 2018-19 we have uploaded two predesigned feedback formats respectively for student and guardian in the college website which is yet to be downloaded and analysed.</p>

It is a part of our policy to maintain properly all the infrastructures within the college campus. The IQAC monitor the status of the infrastructure and recommend for maintenance to the authority from time to time.
(i) Classroom maintenance : In the very beginning of every academic session the authority ensure the proper

environment of various classroom by providing necessary desk-benches, chalk-dusters, electricity connections , regular cleanliness of the classroom also maintained. For proper utilization of the classrooms college design the class routine in such a way so that all class rooms are in use during pick time and also allows the classrooms to KKHSOU Study Centre of the College, Community College Scheme for their classes during Sundays and holidays.

(ii) Laboratory: Laboratories of different departments are regularly maintained. All the science departments have procures necessary instruments during the last five years under the DBT star college Scheme, Mathematics department have developed a well equipped computer lab under this scheme. the laboratory have been properly maintained by initiated reputed technicians from time to time. Other department also take necessary measures for maintenance of the laboratories. College has developed a CIF with sufficient Advanced Equipments which has maintained centrally. To ensure the optimum use of the facility all science departments are encourage to involve in research activities besides scheduled training and workshops for students. Likewise the food processing laboratory is maintained by UGC fund as and when required.

(iii) Library : we have transformed our central library into a well equipped digital library during the last three years period. Air condition facilities has been imparted in the reading section. The college authority is trying its level best for sustenance of this facilities through regular monitoring and maintenance (AMC).

(iv) College Garden: The college have developed a garden as a part of the beautification of the college campus and the same has been maintained properly by appointing a Caretaker appointed on temporary basis.
