As per the order of Honourable Supreme Court of India and subsequent Notification from UGC, ragging constitutes one or more of any intention by any student or group of students on:

- Any act of Indiscipline, Teasing or Handling with Rudeness.
- Any act that Prevents, Disrupts the Regular Academic Activity.
- Any activity which is likely to cause Annoyance, Hardship, Psychological Harm or creates Fear or Apprehension.
- Any Act of Financial Extortion or Forceful Expenditure.
- Any Act of Physical Abuse causing Assault, Harm or danger to Health.
- Any Act of abuse by spoken words, emails, SMS or public insult etc.
- Any Act of injury or infringement of the fundamental right to the human dignity.
- Any Act of Wrong Confinement, Kidnapping, molesting or committing unnatural offences, use of criminal forces, trespass or intimidation.
- Any unlawful assembly or conspiracy to ragging.

As per the guidelines of UGC under the Act of 1956, which is modified as UGC regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in higher Educational Institutions, 2009, the College has established an anti-ragging cell for Building and Preserving a Culture of Ragging Free Environment in the college Campus.

Anti-ragging cell of J. N. College, Boko for the session 2023 - 24 has been reconstituted on 23rd of June, 2023 under the Chairmanship of Principal, Dr. Tapan Dutta with the following members:

Objectives:

Ragging Committee will be the supervisory and advisory committee in preserving a Culture of Ragging Free Environment in the college Campus. The main objectives of this cell are as follows:

- To aware the students of dehumanizing effect of ragging inherent in its perversity.
- To keep a continuous watch and vigil over ragging so as to prevent its occurrence and recurrence.
- Promptly and stringently deal with the incidents of ragging brought to our notice.
- To generate an atmosphere of discipline by sending a clear message that no act of ragging shall be tolerated and any act of ragging shall not go unnoticed and unpunished

Relevance:

Cell gives the students a safe and confidential platform to express their complaints regarding ragging. It aims to build a ragging free environment by instilling the principles of democratic values, tolerance, empathy, compassion and sensitivity to that students become responsible citizens and create an atmosphere of discipline by passing a clear message that no act of ragging in college premises

What action will be taken if any ragging cases arise?

Depending on the nature and gravity of the guilty established by the Anti-Ragging Cell, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely:

- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
- Withholding results.
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
- Cancellation of admission.
- Rustication from the institution for the period of ranging from one to four semesters. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period. Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.
- The college started the academic session of UG programme on August and celebrated the fresher's day was on the last week of August. Under the pretext of 'welcoming' new students to the college, ragging is a practice that gives senior students an excuse to harass their junior counterparts and make them easy targets to satiate their own pleasures.

The Minutes of Anti-Ragging Cell Meeting held on 26/09/2023 are:

1. To aware students on the college code of conduct with zero intolerance towards ragging on or outside college campus.
2. To draw students 'attention towards anti-ragging laws and legal aid for this crime during class and through banners and hoardings on campus.
3. To deal with any arising cases with utmost care and within the legal framework as provided by the Supreme Court.

Action Taken Report:

1. The students are duly informed on the intolerance towards ragging within and outside college campus during the principal's address to the newcomers and in introductory classes of the new session.
2. The students are sensitized on ragging and its various consequences through installed messages and banners and hoardings inside the college campus in various locations.
3. The anti-ragging cell is constantly monitoring to check occurrence of ragging.

The Minutes of Anti-Ragging Cell Meeting held on 20/04/2024 are:

1. To verify whether any occurrence of ragging case has been reported.
2. To take adequate steps to mitigate if any such case been reported.

Action Taken Report:

1. After careful verification it was found that there was no incidence of ragging inside and outside college campus.
2. There is continuous sensitization through lecture and discussion on ragging and its evil impact on society during classes in the beginning of the session as well whenever necessary.
